Control of the pet population

Overpopulation is certainly a major reason to sterilize our pets.

Stopping the heat cycle

After sterilization, the female dog will no longer have any bleeding from the vulva which would otherwise last 21 days and occur every 6 months.

Extension of a healthy life

- 1) Non-sterilized females or females sterilized after their 3rd heat have an increasing rate of mammary tumors. Later in life, another risk is the development of a pyometra, (infection of the uterus)
- 2) Non-castrated male dogs run the risk of developing prostate problems, and peri-anal and/or testicular tumors.

Decrease in behavioral problems

- 1) Non-castrated males are sometimes aggressive.
- 2) The need to defend their territory and urine marking are often observed in non-castrated cats. The expenses for medical treatments if they have cat's fight are high and the smell of their concentrated urine is hard to remove on the furniture, floors and walls.
- 3) A sterilized pet is more sedentary and less likely to run away, decreasing the chances of possible accidents, if not fatal, at least expensive medically.
- 4) Sterilization would eliminate the miauling from the female cat each month when in heat.
