

What should you bring ?



- Leash (short and long)
- Bedding
- Toys
- 2 bowls (water and food)
- Water
- Food and treats
- Tweezers or a De-Ticker
- Health record (make sure all vaccines are up to date)
- Medication (if your animal is regularly on any)
- Your veterinarian's phone number and the number of one close to where you are travelling
- Flea, tick, heartworm prevention...
- Harness for the car
- Skunk off recipe
- Shampoo (in case the dog rolls in dirt)
- Plastic poop bags

Heat stroke !!!

Never leave your pet in the car in hot weather.

The temperature inside a vehicle left in direct sunlight can reach up to 70°C.



The life expectancy of an animal confined in a vehicle with those conditions is 30 minutes. Even open windows may not help.

Travelling with your pet

Before deciding to travel with your pet, it is important to update all basic vaccines and consider all health aspects of the animal.

If vaccination is required before departure, make sure to allow time for effectiveness of the vaccine (10 – 14 days should suffice).

Each country has different requirements. Do your research to prevent surprises.

Kennel cough



Kennel cough is highly contagious and is easily transmitted through air. The incubation period is on average 5 days.

Symptoms range from cough, nasal or eyes discharge, lethargy, loss of appetite and fever. Call your veterinarian if such symptoms appear.
